MAINTENANCE TIPS

IPre-Summer Maintenance Checklist

- **HVAC System**: Check the HVAC system for proper function, including changing filters every month and checking the outdoor units for damage. Please report any issues found promptly to our maintenance department by calling (910) 756-3511 Option 1 or via the Resident Portal
- **Drain Maintenance**: One of the most common maintenance issues in rental properties is clogged drains. To avoid this, be mindful of what goes down the sink or toilet. Drain strainers can be used to catch food particles, hair, and other debris that could lead to clogs. Additionally, never flush items like wipes, cotton balls, or paper towels, as they can cause blockages in plumbing systems. Regularly cleaning drains and using a sink plunger can help prevent clogs and potential water damage.
- Bathroom Fixture Caulking: Inspect the caulk around bathroom fixtures and contact our maintenance department to report any issues to prevent leaks and water damage.
- **Pest Control**: Inspect the interior of your home for pest issues regularly and contact our maintenance department to report promptly to prevent damage.
- Smoke Alarms: Test smoke alarms monthly to ensure they are working properly.
- Window and Blind Care: Clean blinds and windows regularly to improve their functionality and appearance.
- Exterior Maintenance: Inspect and clean the exterior of the property, including flowerbeds, patios, and driveways. Report any issues with gutters and downspouts promptly to our maintenance department to prevent water damage.
- **Moisture Control**: Address moisture issues by checking windows and doors for gaps. Control humidity levels by using exhaust fans in the kitchen and bathroom and moderating the temperature settings on your thermostat.

SAFETY TIPS

Fire Safety:

- Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Detectors: Test alarms monthly and replace them after 10 years.
- Clothes Dryer Maintenance: Ensure the dryer vent is clear and clean.
- Fire Extinguishers: Have fire extinguishers readily available, especially in the kitchen and garage.

COMMUNITY REMINDERS

To maintain a pleasant living environment for all residents, we kindly request your cooperation in adhering to the following community guidelines:

- **Pet Waste:** Please promptly pick up after your pet and dispose of it in designated areas. This is essential, especially as warmer temperatures arrive.
- Property Maintenance:
 - Keep your immediate surroundings and common areas free of debris and clutter. Small limbs or other yard waste should be collected and placed near your garbage and recycling pick up location.
 - Toys should be brought indoors when not in use and never left in shared spaces. Bi-weekly mowing has begun so to prevent damage to personal belongings, please ensure the lawn is clear.
 - Flower bed maintenance and Fenced yard mowing: warmer weather is approaching and so are the weeds.
 Please ensure you maintain your flower beds to keep them free of weeds and debris and be creative to show your families personalities! Fenced yards should be mowed and edged to maintain a neat appearance.
- Parking Restrictions and Vehicle Maintenance: Please refrain from parking on the grass. To ensure you and your family's safety, please park with the flow of traffic.
 - Reminder vehicle maintenance is prohibited in the housing area.
